

In the house World Cultures has focused on Australia. We have designed our own Aboriginal art pictures as well as making traditional things to eat such as Anzac biscuits. Each Thursday evening we have enjoyed dancing to a variety of Australian pop music, in particular the Wiggles Australian National Anthem.





The Spring Term has been an exciting one for Class 3. Pupils have continued to develop the link with Sir Tom Finney Community High School during a weekly PE session. Pupils have been working alongside their peers, forming friendships and learning how to take part in team gymnastics. Other members of the class continue to benefit from weekly Rebound sessions and with the new additions to the Movement Room, we are hoping to use Rebound more frequently in the future.



Class 3 are also trialling a new 'thematic' approach to learning. All lessons are based on the work of Roald Dahl, taking part in re-enacting Roald Dahl's stories (Charlie and the Chocolate Factory, The Twits and George's Marvellous Medicine) and learning about the world and how materials (like chocolate) can be heated or cooled to different effect.



Residential weekend visits this term have included The Lowry Theatre in Salford to watch Chitty Chitty Bang Bang, Blackpool Tower enjoying fish and chips at the famous Harry Ramsdens, Rheged Visitors' Centre in Penrith and local shopping with lunch out at the Hurley Flyer in Morecambe.

FE students have been learning all about China this term. We were very fortunate to have a special visitor who travelled all the way from China to show us how to cook Chinese food. We made some Chinese dumplings which were really tasty.





In our inclusion sessions Class 2 have worked with Silverdale Primary School on creativity. We have designed money containers using various methods such as tie dye and embellishment. We will create purses with our designs.

All the children respond well to inclusive sessions, they can be very responsive to their peers, vocalising and reaching towards them,

Class 1—In our inclusion sessions we have worked with Silverdale Primary School on shape work. They have been working with us to create the round Mr Happy, the rectangular Mr Grumpy, the triangular Mr Rush and Mr Messy.

All the children respond well to inclusive sessions. Maya gets very excited when they come to see us and work with us. Scarlett likes to press her switch to greet her friends.
