They have all been exploring the different areas of school, such as the Rebound Room, Swimming Pool, outside play areas and Sensory Suite.










Some of our pupils have been going to Yealand School for inclusion sessions with their mainstream peers and joining in with PE lessons.

On Mondays students from Upper School have been practising their physical skills in the PE Hall and outside (weather permitting). Lower School pupils have the opportunity to have fun in our warm water pool on Wednesdays and on Thursdays we have been running a food preparation club for pupils from Middle School. We vary the pupils who attend each club over the course of the year to try and make sure that as many as possible have the chance to participate. There is no charge for taking part and, in some circumstances, we are able to offer transport home as well.







Winter Wonderland

During the first weekend in December we held our first ever Winter Wonderland in the Residential Grounds. There was a sensory trail, a snow area, a gingerbread house and the chance to write a letter and post it to Santa. The elves were in their Grotto with a special gift for each child. It was lovely to see so many pupils (including former pupils) there with their families, along with members of the public who gave us some lovely feedback — "Thank you for the photo. Governors' Perspective - Rosemary Dyson

This the first contribution to the school newsletter from one of the school governors; it is planned that you will hear from others in subsequent issues. So here goes....

I have been a governor at Bleasdale for nearly 8 years and most recently it's Chair and that is both a pleasure and a challenge. But more of that later! Firstly it might be useful to set some context.

A governing body has three key roles: setting vision and strategic direction; holding the Head Teacher to account for the educational performance of the school; overseeing the financial performance and making sure it is money well spent. In practice this means we provide support, and sometimes a different perspective to, the day to day leadership of the school; we always endeavour to consider the longer term. This is done through a series of committees that cover different aspects; membership is shared amongst the governing body according to individual experience and/or interest.

So what does that mean for me? As a governor I attend the Finance and Staffing committees; these happen once a term and, with Kirsty (Acting Head) and Joel (School Business Manager), we review performance to date; consider what is needed in the coming terms plus any immediate issues that need attention. As Chair, I run the Full Governors meeting held towards the end of each term. We hear reports from all aspects of the school for agreement or discussion and as a Lancashire County Council school we consider the latest issues raised by them e.g. policies, government initiatives; the shape of the next school years. In between I keep in touch through visits to the school to observe/walkabout and to meet with Kirsty to discuss progress and development.

Now back to pleasure and challenge. For me it is a pleasure to be a part of a governing body of like minded, enthusiastic and committed people striving to support Kirsty, the Senior Leadership Team and Staff to maintain Bleasdale as an outstanding provision. However it is a continuing challenge to balance the demands of immediate needs with the strategic view of 'what's next?' Most days pleasure wins out!
