




As the weather has improved Riding for the Disabled has started up again, this time at the Westmorland Show Ground. Pupils enjoy taking turns to ride with Monty.

As part of Class 1's sensory story lessons we have been reading 'Handa's Surprise' and Handa's Hen'. We have been exploring the different fruit and animals in the stories. We have been grasping paintbrushes to paint the animals from the story.





Class 3 enjoyed a 'circus skills' themed parents session, we made popcorn, took turns in the 'big top' and explored sensory stations with juggling balls, splatting foam and wet sponge throwing! Thank you again to those parents who came in to join us.





Ryan has continued his inclusion at Morecambe Road School one afternoon a week where he takes part in communication sessions with his new friends. More recently the rest of the class have had inclusion links with a class from the Loyne School, who will be joining us on Wednesday mornings for our reading sessions. The first visit went well and all pupils joined in the session before spending break time on the new playground.

FE are very busy this term taking learning into the community. Students are applying their school based learning into real life contexts including; identifying social signs, communicating with unfamiliar people and completing focused tasks.





Class 4 have enjoyed taking part in Yoga sessions with Alex Davidson our Sports Co-ordinator

Class 3 have been working together during Skills for Learning sessions, practising grasping and releasing skills and pressing the switch to let their partner know it's their turn. Some pupils have really developed their physical skills too by sitting on class chairs around the table - it is much easier to work together this way.





On Monday evenings residential pupils have been taking part in trike and vehicle maintenance. Pupils have explored resources such as handle bars, inner tubes and a range of different pumps whist listening to appropriate songs such as 'Riding along on my push bike' by Mungo Jerry. Next they collected their buckets of soapy water and mops and cleaned the school vehicle and trikes. Some even hoovered inside and tested the horn and windscreen wipers. But the best fun of all came when it was time to use the hose pipe, everyone got a little damp!
